Player Code of Conduct

The Woodland Girls Fastpitch Softball Association has implemented the following Code of Conduct to outline the proper expectations for players participating in the program. Each player must read, or have read to them, understand and sign this form prior to participating in our league.

We believe that conformance to the Code of Conduct is paramount to ensuring an enjoyable, respectful, and safe environment in which to develop our players physically, socially and emotionally. As such, any individual violating the WGFSA Code of Conduct shall be reported and subject to disciplinary action as set forth in the Violations section of the code.

Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring and Good Citizenship. The highest potential of sports is achieved when competition reflects these “six pillars of character”

I therefore agree:

1. I will learn the rules of the game.
2. I will be responsible for notifying the manager or coach of my absence at any practice or game.
3. I will be a positive role model for my peers and encourage sportsmanship by showing respect and courtesy, by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, officials and spectators at every game or practice.
4. I will not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player, or parent such as booing and taunting; refusing to shake hands; or using profane language or gestures.
5. I will not encourage any behaviors or practices that would endanger the health or well-being of any other players.
6. I will resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.
7. I will treat other players, coaches, officials and spectators with respect regardless of race, creed, color, sex or ability.
8. I will never ridicule or yell at other participants for making a mistake or losing a competition.
9. I will respect the officials and their authority.
10. I want a sports environment that is free from drugs, tobacco, and alcohol and I will refrain from their use at all sporting events.
11. I will not post any inappropriate or derogatory remarks or photos in regard to WGFSA, my team or any other participants on ANY social media.
12. I understand that during any school suspension I will also be suspended from WGFSA.

I further agree that if I fail to abide by this Code of Conduct, I will be reported and subject to any or all of the disciplinary actions as outlined below:

Reporting Conduct Violations:

Violations by Parents, Players or Spectators shall be reported as soon as possible to the Team Manager or Head Coach. It is the responsibility of the Manager/Coach to address the violation

in a timely and respectful manner. It is also their responsibility to notify the WGFSA Issues Committee of any reports of violation and the manner in which they were addressed.

In the event of a violation the Manager/Coach feels the WGFSA Issues Committee should be involved, they will email issues@wgfsa.com to report the violation as soon as practical.

Violations by Coaches or Managers shall be reported as soon as possible to the Player Agent for that age group, player agent email addresses are listed under the Board Members tab of our website at www.wgfsa.org.

Addressing Conduct Violations:

Conduct violations may be addressed by any, or all, of the following people and methods in any order deemed appropriate to the violation.

Umpires have the responsibility to immediately address conduct violations during games or practices. Umpires have the ultimate authority to issue verbal warnings and/or eject any player, parent, spectator, manager or coach from games. Umpires have ultimate authority during games and their decisions cannot be appealed.

Managers/Coaches have the responsibility to immediately address conduct violations during games or practices and to follow up on any received reports of violations. Managers/Coaches have the authority to issue verbal warnings, written warnings and/or eject any player, parent or spectator from games or practices. With the exception of ejection from a game or practice, decisions by the Manager/Coach may be appealed to the Player Agent.

Player Agents have the responsibility to promptly follow up with any reports of violation received and to hear appeals of the decisions by Managers/Coaches. Player Agents have the authority to issue verbal warnings, written warnings and single or multi game suspensions. Decisions by the player agent may be appealed to the Issues Committee.

The Issues Committee has the responsibility to promptly follow up with any reports of violation received directly as well as to hear appeals to the decisions by Player Agents. The Issues Committee has the authority to issue all previously listed disciplinary actions as well as season suspensions, suspension from the league and in the case of Manager/Coach, the authority to suspend their ability to manage/coach on a short- or long-term basis. The Issues Committee has ultimate authority for the League and their decision cannot be appealed.
